The Department of Arts Administration, Education & Policy (AAEP) melded two distinct graduate programs, Art Education and Arts Policy & Administration in 2011. In an effort to dismantle siloed faculty and students, the department unanimously supported the idea to unify the department in name and in mission. As a result, the department faculty has been conducting ongoing curricular review for the past few years, identifying ways to better support a unified department. There has been close consideration of the plan of study for all programs, especially the AAEP PhD program. The faculty considered a number of factors as they deliberated over the changes to be made to the plan of study. These factors include suggestions made by a department ad hoc curriculum committee, a student survey, and recommendations by external program reviewers.

Primarily, the ad hoc curriculum committee reviewed the graduate program curriculum for the PhD in AAEP, MA in Art Education, and the MA in Arts Policy & Administration. The department disseminated a student survey that allowed students to offer feedback about specific program options within the department. Some comments indicated that students would like more overlap between art education and APA because they felt a clear boundary, especially when it came to gaining relationships with certain faculty members. Finally, AAEP had an external review in September 2017 and received programmatic feedback from three colleagues in the field from peer institutions. The review yielded fairly positive results, but the reviewers noted that there needs to be a much stronger effort to synthesize the Art Education program and the Arts Policy & Administration program. In addition to these three influences (committee, survey, and external review), as a faculty, we have noticed a lack of confidence and authority in our students' ability to engage comfortably with theory. Faculty have identified the need for students to better comprehend and operationalize theory and concepts in art education. Therefore, to remedy this, we are now explicitly naming two specific courses for MA students, instead of leaving it to students to choose the courses to fulfill this requirement. Please see below for the specific suggested changes to our plan of study for the Art Education MA in AAEP.

Suggested changes to the degree plan include:

- 1.) Under Section A: Initial Required Studies:
 - i.) We will now require all students, regardless of specialization, to take both ARTEDUC 7000.10: Concepts, Theories, and Issues in Art Education AND ARTEDUC 7000.20 Concepts, Theories, and Issues in Arts/Culture Policy as two seven-week courses, for two credit hours each, in the first semester of entering the program. These two courses were initially two 15 week courses and offered as an either/or option depending on the students intended specialization (Art Education or Cultural Policy). This change speaks to the initial critique of the separation of the two programs (art education & arts policy and administration)
 - ii.) This course change increases the total required course hours in this section to 7, from 6. The total required hours for this degree is now 31, instead of 30. However, the additional hour does not necessarily add additional time/semesters on to this degree. It is simply a result of the two seven week courses.

- 2.) Under Section B: Theory, Concepts & Research:
 - i.) There were initially no designated required courses listed under this section. Students were allowed to choose their own courses for this section and the courses they chose did not always teach them to operationalize theory and concepts. We have now identified two courses that we feel are necessary for MA art education students. These two courses offer foundational theoretical frameworks and praxis that faculty see students lacking as they begin to engage in their thesis writing and/or project development.

New Theory Requirement: ARTEDUC 7701: Contemporary Theory and Art Education **AND** ARTEDUC 7100: Histories and Policies of Arts Education.

These changes have been shared with both the Graduate Studies Committee and the large AAEP department, which was voted on and faculty approved of the suggested changes and program plan.
