Dear Professor Kafantaris,

On Friday, March 8, the Arts and Humanities 1 Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed your proposal for a new first-year seminar, "Foreign Queens from Cleopatra to Meghan Markle."

The Panel unanimously approved the proposed seminar with one contingency and five recommendations:

- Recommendation: The course number should be 1137 if it is graded A-E.
- Recommendation: The syllabus should include a grading scale.
- Recommendation: The panel recommends having a more clear attendance policy, especially regarding how tardiness with impact grades.
- Recommendation: The panel recommends changing the course title and description from "Foreign Queens" to something more general (e.g. "Foreign Royals") since certain individuals in the syllabus (i.e. Meghan Markle and Wallis Simpson) do not fall under the category of "Queens."
- Recommendation: The panel recommends including more specifics about readings (e.g. page numbers).
- Contingency: The syllabus should include the standard disability statement found on page 14 of the Curriculum and Assessment Operations Manual (<u>https://asccas.osu.edu/sites/asccas.osu.edu/files/ASC_Curriculum_and_Assessment_Operations_Manual_2018-</u>
