Russian 359, Masterpieces of 20th and 21st Century Russian Literature, fulfills the non-US/non-Europe literature requirement of the Arts and Humanities GEC category. The course concentrates on aspects of reading, considering, talking and writing about contemporary Russian culture through its literary production. While studying some of the masterpieces of modern Russian literature, students will look at the works in their historical and cultural context. The development of Soviet literature and the dissident and post-Soviet reaction to that codified literary system will offer a framework for discussing what great literature is, in both Russian and general contexts
