On Friday, September 13, the Social and Behavioral Sciences Panel of the ASCC reviewed a proposal to create new course Anthropology 3005

The Panel unanimously approved the request with three recommendations:

- When creating the student version of the syllabus, include the due dates of assignments on the schedule.
- The panel was confused about the breakdown of credit for each assignment. Maybe change it so that each assignment is worth an even percentage instead of the current 3.214%.
- Clarify the number of assignments that students are required to complete. The panel counted 16 assignments listed in the syllabus (13 write, 2 create, 1 map), but the table on p. 4 mentions 14 assignments.

The course will now be advanced to OAA and OUR.
