Dear all,

On Wednesday, October 16, the Arts and Humanities 2 Panel reviewed a request to offer Comparative Studies 1100 (an existing course with GE Literature & GE Diversity-Global Studies) in 100% distance learning format.

The Panel unanimously approved the request with one recommendation regarding the GE assessment plan: The direct assessment questions sound more like indirect assessment. In other words, they appear to be more reflections on the part of the students rather than questions directly based on the literature read or the films viewed in the course. If in the future Comparative Studies 1100 is submitted with these sample questions for inclusion in the new General Education program, this point will likely be brought up.

The course request was advanced by our office directly after the meeting last Wednesday, & I see that the changes have already been approved by the Registrar's Office.
