Hi Wendy,

As you know, the Earth Sciences certificates were all approved by ASCC on Friday but all the advising sheets have to be changed so I am going to send back the 4 certificates to you.

(A) *On all the sheets*, the following paragraph needs to be deleted:

Overlap with a major:

Max 50% overlap with major program courses

Replace with:

Overlap with courses in degree

- The certificate must be in a different subject than the major.
- Max 50% overlap with courses in a degree program (i.e., major,

minor, other certificate, or GE).

(B) *In addition*, for the following programs, could you please make the following changes, which will make the proposal fully clean/understandable to the next committees (Grad School and CAA):

- Hydrogeology: at this point, delete document “revisions to Certificate in Hydrogeology”—those were responses to the NMS Panel (and neither the Grad School nor CAA will understand what this document is all about + the revisions have been inserted in the revised proposal)
- Marine Science: include the completion sheet and the updated letter from Steve within the actual proposal (in the same pdf doc). In turn, when I get back the certificate, I will delete the 2 docs that I had uploaded. (Otherwise having original and updated docs will totally confuse the Grad School and CAA.)
- Natural History Museum Curation: include the completion sheet and the updated letter from Steve within the actual proposal. In turn, when I get back the certificate, I will delete the 2 docs that I had uploaded.
- Petroleum Geology: include the updated letter from Steve within the actual proposal. In turn, when I get back the certificate, I will delete Steve’s updated letter that I had uploaded.

Let me know if any of this does not make sense.

When I get the certificates back, I will move them on to the Graduate School!!
