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Dear Bernadette et al.,

Thanks for your email. Please find below answers to your questions and clarifications about the difference between the 3005 and 7005.

We considered offering a 5000-level course that both undergraduates and graduates would be able to take, but we realized that while many of the job market skills are quite similar, the jobs that students will be applying for are very different.

One of the major components of the course are the guest speakers. The speakers will explain how they used their anthropological skills in the job search as well as in their professional careers. The guest speakers in the undergraduate course will be quite different from those in the graduate course.

The difference in job markets is also reflected in the readings. In the graduate course, we can assign the entire *Handbook of Practicing Anthropology*, because all the chapters are relevant for students with a PhD, while in the undergraduate course we can only use a number of the chapters.

In short, we are afraid that if we combined the undergraduate and graduate students, we would have two constituencies that would feel that large parts of the course are not meeting their needs.

We have only a few students in our program who pursue both their undergraduate and graduate studies in our department. Even for these students, I would recommend that they take the graduate version if they had already taken the undergraduate version.

I hope that these clarifications help. Please let me know if you need any additional information.

Dear Professor Hubbe,

On Friday, October 25, the Social and Behavioral Sciences Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee (ASCC) reviewed a proposal for new course Anthropology 7005.

The Panel did not vote on the course but would like the following matter addressed first:

The syllabus for the course is identical to the one that the Panel recently approved for Anthropology 3005 "Careers with Anthropology", except for the last 4 weeks in the schedule. The Panel would like an explanation on why those courses are offered at both the undergraduate and the graduate level with almost identical content. What would happen if a student were an undergraduate and later a graduate student in the Department? Has the Department considered offering both courses as one 5000-level course open to both undergraduate and graduate students with slightly different content/expectations/approaches for both groups? The panel can further help the department but first needs information on the intended relationship between 3005 and 7005.

If you have any questions about this feedback, do not hesitate to follow up with Susan Kline, faculty Chair of the SBS Panel (cc'd here). I will keep the course in our queue while awaiting the Department's response.
