In our current program there are five different graphics courses: 5261, 5262, 5263.01, 5263.02 and 5263.03. These are cross-disciplinary and cover nearly all of the same learning goals. The remaining goals and more advanced graphics techniques are covered in existing discipline-specific design courses.
