Muslin and craft paper will be supplied to you. Although many of the other notions are contained in the studio and you are welcome to use them. I suggest you obtain your own fabric scissors, C-Thru ruler and fashion ruler.

#### **ASSIGNMENTS:**

- **Project** #1 **Four Dart Bodice:** You will drape and make a pattern for a four dart bodice as demonstrated in class. Once patterned, cut and made into a mock-up, your bodice will open FRONT. Later in the course, you will drape a COLLAR for this bodice, which will be added to the mock up (so it must fit the neck opening you have established).
- **Project #2 Princess Bodice:** You will drape and make a pattern for a princess bodice as demonstrated in class. Once patterned, cut and made into a mock-up, your bodice will open BACK. Later in the course, you will drape a COLLAR for this bodice, which will be added to the mock up (so it must fit the neck opening you have established).
- **Project #3 Sleeves:** You will flat pattern as per instructions a basic one piece sleeve and manipulate that sleeve to get a two- piece sleeve. You will stitch one of each sleeve into the right arms eye of each bodice.
- **Project #4 Skirt:** You will drape and pattern a six panel straight skirt with a side opening, then make the mockup.
- **Project #5 Dress #1 ('60s**) You will drape from a pattern sketch a 1960's dress. You will make a pattern and mock-up.
- **Project #6 Dress #2 ('40's)** You will drape from a pattern sketch a 1940's dress. You will make a pattern and mock-up.
