COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course is an in depth study of advanced projects in Costume Design with an emphasis on musical theatre.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES: This course is intended to sharpen your skills as an artist working in both pencil and water color media; to gain more experience in designing characters for musical comedy/music video; to manipulate designs to suit various genres and to gain experience swatching your designs with appropriate textiles.

TEACHING METHOD: Lecture/Discussion/Studio. (Assignments will be completed outside of class sessions.)

I will be supplying texts for you for *Sweeney Todd* and *Guys and Dolls*.

RECOMMENDED TEXTS:

SUPPLIES: Watercolor paints, brushes, pencils, paper no smaller than 9x12. No figures shall be smaller than 10” tall. **All renderings will include fabric and trim swatches unless otherwise noted. Swatches must be neatly affixed to each rendering. All renderings must be appropriately labeled with title of play, character, act and scene (if appropriate).**

ASSIGNMENTS: You will be working on 4 design projects of varying complexity. Your projects are:

1. **The Four Seasons:** Choose a period from 1200 – 1800 CE. Choose a pop song that the four women listed below might sing together at a major music awards (televised) show. You will be designing clothing, inspired by the time period and song you choose, for:
Summer (Rihanna), Spring (Katy Perry), Winter (Lady Gaga), Autumn (Beyoncé). Each woman will rotate singing a verse or two. All women will be singing on stage together, so be careful that one doesn't draw undue focus over the others. The time period you have chosen, the season assigned to each singer as well as each singer's individual personal aesthetic should be apparent in your designs.

2. **Guys and Dolls:** You will be setting this musical in the time period it was written: early 1950's, so plan to narrow your research from 1945 -1955. You will be designing **FIVE** costumes for "A Bushel and a Peck" including Miss Adelaide and her choristers. Cast to be distributed.

3. **Caroline, or Change** This play is set in Lake Charles, Louisiana in autumn 1963, just prior to and around the assassination of President Kennedy. You will be designing costumes for **SIX** characters: Caroline, The Washing Machine, The Radio, The Dryer, The Moon and The Bus. Your cast will be all African-American. Cast to be distributed.

4. **Sweeney Todd:** This play is set roughly in the mid-19th century. It is derived from a "penny dreadful", which compares loosely to the contemporary graphic novel. You will be designing costumes for **SIX** principals including Mrs. Lovett, Sweeney Todd, Johanna, Adolfo Pirelli, Tobias Ragg (Toby) and the Beggar Woman and you will also be designing **FIVE** chorus members – two male and three female. Cast to be distributed.

GRADING: Each project will receive a grade for: appropriateness to character, performer and style of play; appropriate and complete fabric swatching; neatness and completion of presentation and format and aesthetic quality. You will present the project in class and receive a written evaluation.

I'm writing from the Department of Theatre concerning the revision of our graduate curriculum in design. As part of our revision there are four courses whose topics are likely adjacent to your program in Fashion and Retail Studies.

To provide some context: we have two courses that we currently teach regularly, **7511 Advanced Costume Design** and **8521 Advanced Topics Costume Technology**. Currently, our grad students take each of these courses multiple times and

their syllabi each alternate between two topics. In our revision, these four syllabi will be codified as four separate courses:

5502 Costume Draping & Patterning

5503 Advanced Costume Technology

5512 Costume Design II

7513 Advanced Costume Design

Our two existing courses will be replaced with these four, but they are only new in name and number. As we move forward, we hope to receive your concurrence on these courses. Attached, please find a copies of the syllabi and concurrence forms for each. Please let me know if you have any questions or concerns. We will look for a response from your department by March 3rd.
