Dear Professors Craigmile, Herbei and Kaizar,

On Monday, January 11th, the Natural and Mathematical Sciences Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed course change proposals for Statistics 6450, Statistics 5301, Statistics 6201 and Statistics 5302. Please find below the Panel's feedback for these courses.

- Statistics 6450 (course change) and Statistics 6201 (course change) approved with two recommendations:
 - Recommendation: The Panel recommends that it may be good practice to include in the syllabus if a course includes both asynchronous and synchronous lectures in a distance-learning course and at what day and time the synchronous lectures are offered to better help students construct their schedules.
 - Recommendation: The current syllabus includes information about undergraduate level advising. The Panel recommends removing this language and replacing it with graduate level advising information.

- Statistics 5301 (course change) and Statistics 5302 (course change) approved with two recommendations:
 - Recommendation: The Panel recommends that it may be good practice to include in the syllabus if a course includes both asynchronous and synchronous lectures in a distance-learning course and at what time day and time the synchronous lectures are offered to better help students construct their schedules.
 - Recommendation: The current syllabus includes information about only undergraduate level advising. The Panel recommends adding graduate level advising information.

Statistics 6450, Statistics 5301, Statistics 6201 and Statistics 5302 has been advanced to the next step in the approval process.
