Good afternoon,

On Thursday, September 9th, the Social and Behavioral Sciences Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a revision to the Social Sciences Air Transportation major.

The Panel did not vote on the proposal and would like the following feedback items addressed:

- Major-specific goals and assessment plan:
 - The Panel asks that major-specific Goals and Expected Learning Outcomes be developed and articulated within the proposal for the major program and also within the curriculum map for the major program.
 - The Panel would like to see an Assessment plan that is specific for this particular major program.
 - Goals and ELOs for the major as well as a major specific curriculum map were included in the original 2012 proposal approved by the College and CAA. The Panel suggests that these be used as a starting point.
 - Please remove the departmental curriculum map and assessment plan.
- As previously indicated, the information in the box on p. 13 of the proposal (requirements for social science electives: the ability to overlap courses in the GE and the major & the ability to have non-GE courses count for GE) was not part of the major proposal the last time it was approved by the College and CAA in 2012. This language should be removed. Overlap is not permitted, non-GE courses should not be used to satisfy GE credit, and such exceptions are not necessary as students can complete their degree within 121 credit hours.
- Sample 4-year plan: The Panel requests that a sentence be added indicating that this plan is for a student not pursuing the pilot certification option.

Additionally, for your convenience, I have attached the 2012 approved proposal of the Social Sciences Air Transportation major as a PDF file.
