On Wednesday, May 5<sup>th</sup>, the Arts and Humanities 1 Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a distance learning proposal for Arabic 1102.01.

The Panel unanimously approved the request with four recommendations:

- **Recommendation**: The Panel recommends adding the course time to the syllabus to indicate how many hours per week the class will meet.
- **Recommendation**: The Panel noticed that this course is also taught as a summer term, 8 week course. They recommend adding this as an option in curriculum.osu.edu, as currently only 12 and 14 week sessions are selected.
- **Recommendation**: The Panel asks that the GE Goals and ELO language used be the generic, consistent language provided by the College. This language can be found on the ASC Curriculum and Assessment Services website at <a href="https://asccas.osu.edu/curriculum/general-education-goals-and-expected-learning-outcomes">https://asccas.osu.edu/curriculum/general-education-goals-and-expected-learning-outcomes</a>.
- **Recommendation**: The Panel asks that the department consider Ian Anderson's recommendation of not requiring students to keep their cameras on during synchronous Zoom lessons. While having their cameras on does contribute to student success, this is not a policy that can be enforced under current University rules.

Arabic 1102.01 will continue through the approval process.
