- The Panel requests that the course be moved to a higher course number designation (such as to the 3000-level). This course appears significantly more advanced compared to other, comparable courses within the Department of Anthropology at the 2000-level.

- The Panel asks if this new course will become a part of any major programs offered by the Department of Anthropology. If this is the case, please provide a curriculum map for each program this new course can become a part of.
- On page 4 of the syllabus, under the Grading Policy section, there is mention of the course using the OSU standard grading scheme. Please remove this language, as Ohio State does not have a standardized grading scheme.
