Good morning,

On Monday, October 10, the Themes Panel 1 of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a request for Linguistics 3803. Please see below for the Panel's feedback on this proposal. {N.B. **Contingencies (bolded)** require revision and resubmission to the Panel chair, while *recommendations (italicized)* or comments are suggestions from the Panel that an instructor can implement at their discretion when the course is taught.}

LINGUISTICS 3803 | Unanimously approved with **one (1) contingency** and *two (2) recommendations*

- **CONTINGENCY:** The reviewing faculty ask that the most up-to-date, full and complete GEN Goals and ELOs for the Lived Environments theme be included in the course syllabus, per a requirement of General Education courses. - *RECOMMENDATION:* The reviewing faculty recommend removing any reference to an "OSU standard grading scheme," as Ohio State does not have a standardized grading scheme.
- *RECOMMENDATION:* The Arts and Sciences Curriculum Committee recently approved newly updated standard syllabus statements. The reviewing faculty kindly note that the mental health and SLDS statements provided are not the latest versions, and suggest revising them accordingly to ensure that the most current language and information appears for these student resources.
