On Wednesday, September 22nd, the Arts and Humanities 1 Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed distance learning course proposals for Philosophy 2500 and 3210.

The Panel voted to unanimously approve Philosophy 2500 with one contingency and two recommendations:

- **Contingency**: The Panel requests additional information, such as length and format, of course assignments and, particularly, the course exams as discussed on pages 5 and 6 of the course syllabus.
- **Recommendation**: The Panel kindly suggests adding a few sentences under the Late Assignments section of the syllabus (on page 6) that lets students know what steps must be taken if they must submit an assignment late due to legitimate, excusable circumstances.
- **Recommendation**: The Panel recommends providing stronger incentive for student attendance and participation in synchronous sessions, perhaps similar to the policy of the in-person course syllabus.

The Panel voted to unanimously approve Philosophy 3210 with one contingency and one recommendation:

- **Contingency**: The Panel requests additional information, such as length and format, of course assignments as discussed on 5 of the syllabus.
- **Recommendation**: The Panel kindly suggests adding a few sentences under the Late Assignments section of the syllabus (on page 5) that lets students know what steps must be taken if they must submit an assignment late due to legitimate, excusable circumstances.

I will return Philosophy 2500 and 3210 to the departmental queue via curriculum.osu.edu in order to address the Panel's points above.
