On Wednesday, September 22nd, the Arts and Humanities 1 Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a new course proposal for Classics 3205.

The Panel voted to unanimously approve the request with two comments and two contingencies:

- **Contingency:** The Panel requests that additional information, and clarity of number of assignments, be included about course assignments, especially regarding the series of papers found on page 4 of the syllabus.
- **Contingency:** The Panel asks that the deadlines for course specific assignments be placed within the weekly calendar.
- **Comment:** The Panel would like a note to be made to the REGD Panel asking them to consider whether a concurrence from the Department of WGSS would be necessary for this course, given the course content.
- **Comment:** The Panel found this course to be an excellent part of the Classical Humanities concentration and encourages you to consider whether it might also be a valuable option for the other concentrations in the program.
