Good afternoon.

On Wednesday, November 17th, the Arts and Humanities 1 Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a course proposal for English 4189.

The Panel unanimously approved the request with three recommendations:

- Recommendation: The Panel recommends that the department consider the workload placed on students for a 3 CH class. Per the Faculty Rules, (Section 3335-8-24; https://trustees.osu.edu/bylaws-and-rules/3335-8,) a three credit hour class should take an average of 9 hours per week to earn an average grade (C), and the syllabus outlines a minimum of 9.5 per week hours for a passing grade (S).
- Recommendation: The Panel recommends that the department clarify the language surrounding attendance and the requirements to earn a grade of "S". The syllabus currently states that students must "complete all course work" to receive a grade of "S" (syllabus pg. 6 under "Grading Scale"), but the Attendance & Participation policies (syllabus pg. 3) do not detail how many absences a student can have and still consider this component of the course "complete", or if the instructor differentiates between excused and unexcused absences.
- Recommendation: The Panel recommends reconsidering the option to offer this class in a 4-week format due to the student workload.

English 4189 will continue through the approval process.
