On Friday, April 15th, the Themes Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a new GE Theme: Citizenship for a Diverse and Just World proposal for AAAS 3450. Please see below for the Panel's feedback.

The Panel unanimously approved the request with two recommendations:

- **Recommendation:** The reviewing faculty recommend updating the Title IX statement to the most up-to-date version, which can be found on the ASC Curriculum and Assessment Services website at: <https://ascas.osu.edu/curriculum/syllabus-elements>.
- **Recommendation:** The reviewing faculty recommend removing language mentioning the OSU standard grading scheme, as Ohio State does not have an official, standardized grading scale and instructors are free to use a grading scale that best serves the needs of their course.

AAAS 3450 will continue through the approval process.
