On Wednesday, February 9th, the Race, Ethnicity and Gender Diversity Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a course proposal for Anthropology 1101.

The Panel unanimously approved the request with one recommendation:

Recommendation: While the Panel notes that the specific course objectives (syllabus pg. 1) do discuss how this course engages with the GE Goals and ELOs, the ASCC does require a specific statement that explains to students how this course meets the GE Goals and ELOs. The Panel recommends that a separate statement be included between the GE Goals and ELOs and the Course Objectives to address this requirement

Anthro 1101 will continue through the approval process.
