Good afternoon,

On Thursday, November 18th, the Themes Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a new GE Themes: Citizenship for a Diverse and Just World proposal for Sociology 3200. As a reminder, in order to receive full approval, please provide a revision that addresses all of the Panel's contingencies as outlined below. The Panel's recommendations can be implemented by the course instructor at the time of instruction and do not need to be made at this time to receive full approval.

The Panel approved with request with one contingency and one recommendation:

- **Contingency:** The reviewing faculty request that the department add the GE Goals, ELOs and a statement explaining how the course satisfies the GE ELOs, as this is a requirement for GE courses in the College of Arts and Sciences. The GE language can found on the Office of Academic Affairs website at: <https://oaa.osu.edu/ohio-state-ge-program>.
- **Recommendation:** The grading scale contains the letter grade of "F" and the Ohio State University does not award the letter grade of "F". The Panel recommends that this be amended and the letter grade of "E" be replaced.

I will return Sociology 3200 to the departmental queue in curriculum.osu.edu in order to address the Panel's feedback.
