Good afternoon,

On Friday, September 16, the Themes Panel 1 of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed the proposal for Health and Rehabilitation Science 4000. Please find below the Panel's feedback for this proposal. {N.B. **Contingencies (bolded)** require revision and resubmission to the Panel chair, while *recommendations (italicized)* or comments are suggestions from the Panel that an instructor can implement at their discretion when the course is taught.}

HEALTH AND REHABILITATION SCIENCE 4000 | Unanimously approved with **one (1) contingency** and *one (1) recommendation*

- **CONTINGENCY:** On pages 2-3 of the syllabus, the reviewing faculty kindly note that the full and complete GE Goals and ELOs for the Citizenship for a Diverse and Just World theme need to appear in the course syllabus, per a requirement of General Education courses. Specifically, they ask that you add Goals 1 and 2, as well as corresponding ELOs 1.1, 1.2, 2.1, and 2.2, which can be found on the ASCCAS website: <https://ascas.osu.edu/new-general-education-gen-goals-and-elos>.
- *RECOMMENDATION:* On page 3 of the syllabus, under the "Course Policies" section, the link provided connects to four different handbooks, all pertaining to majors within the School of Health and Rehabilitation Sciences. Since this is a GE course, the Panel recommends removing this resource to prevent student confusion.

I will return Health and Rehabilitation Science 4000 to the department queue in order to address the Panel's requests.
