On Wednesday, January 19th, the Arts and Humanities 1 Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a new course request for Philosophy 2456.

The Panel voted to unanimously approve the request with one contingency and three recommendations. Please see the Panel's feedback below. As a reminder, a revision must be uploaded in curriculum.osu.edu that satisfies the Panel's contingency in order to move forward in the approval process while the Panel's recommendations may be implemented when the course is first taught.

- **Contingency:** The Panel asks that the course syllabus provide more explanation (including due dates) of course assignments, specifically the three papers and the weekly discussion posts on Carmen.
- **Recommendation:** The Panel recommends utilizing the most up-to-date Title IX Statement, as Kellie Brennan is no longer the Title IX Coordinator. The most up-to-date statement can be found on the ASC Curriculum and Assessment Services website at: https://asccas.osu.edu/curriculum/syllabus-elements.
- **Recommendation:** The Panel recommends adding a grading scale to the course syllabus.
- **Recommendation:** As the department is aware, ELO 3.2 for the Health and Wellbeing GE Theme has recently been adjusted. The Panel notes that, should the department wish to change any elements of the course to better suit the new GE Theme: Health and Wellbeing ELO 3.2, this would be an appropriate time before the course visits the ASCC Themes Panel.
