On Friday, February 10th, the Themes 1 Panel reviewed a GEN Theme: Lived Environments, GEN Theme: Sustainability, and High-Impact Practice: Interdisciplinary Team-Teaching request for EEOB/History/Earth Sciences 2911. Please see below for their feedback.

I am please to report that the Panel unanimously approved the request with one recommendation:

- **Recommendation:** The reviewing faculty recommend creating a short “How this course works” section of the syllabus to help explain to students how this course is both interdisciplinary and team-taught in nature. Additionally, they recommend stating on page 1 of the syllabus, towards the beginning, that this is a 4-credit hour, interdisciplinary, team-taught course, as they find this may be a benefit to students.

EEOB/History/Earth Sciences 2911 will continue through the approval process. My office has advanced the proposal to OAA.
