On Monday, April 18th, the Arts and Humanities 1 Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a change-of-level request for EEOB/Earth Science/History 2911. Please see below for the Panel's feedback.

The Panel unanimously approved the proposal with two recommendations:

- **Recommendation:** The Panel recommends fixing several typos in the GE language within all three of the course syllabi, specifically:
 - On pages 8-9, the ELOs are the same for Sustainability and Lived Environments and it is recommended that the correct ELOs be listed for the respective Theme categories (and can be found on the Office of Academic Affairs website at: https://oaa.osu.edu/ohio-state-ge-program).
 - The Goals and ELOs for the Citizenship for a Diverse and Just World (as found on page 10 of the syllabus) mention studying "Sustainability".
- **Recommendation:** The Panel recommends utilizing the most up-to-date Title IX information, as found on the ASC Curriculum and Assessment Services website at: https://asccas.osu.edu/curriculum/syllabus-elements.

EEOB/Earth Science/History 2911 will continue through the approval process.
