Good afternoon,

On Monday, March 21st, the Arts and Humanities 1 Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a distance learning request for Turkish 2101. Please see below for the Panel's feedback:

Turkish 2101 was unanimously approved with the following recommendations:

- **Recommendation:** The Panel recommends having students meet for 55 minute periods instead of the intended 60 minutes (as stated on the first page of the syllabus) to best line up with standard OSU class schedules. This has potential to impact a student's ability to enroll in their other courses.
- **Recommendation:** On page 2 and 3 of the syllabus, the credit hour expectation section is listed twice. The Panel recommends one of these sets of information be removed from the syllabus for student clarity.
- **Recommendation:** The Panel recommends not assigning students coursework over designated University holidays (such as Spring Break), as breaks are designed with student wellness in mind and the College of Arts and Sciences has been placing heavy emphasis on increasing student wellness.

Turkish 2101 will continue through the approval process.
