On Thursday, June 9th, the Themes Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a new GE Theme: Health and Well-being and GE Theme: Citizenship for a Diverse and Just World request for Political Science 2120. Please see below for the Panel's feedback.

GE Theme: Health and Wellbeing was unanimously approved by the Panel.

GE Theme: Citizenship for a Diverse and Just World was not voted on as the Panel would like the following feedback items addressed:

- The reviewing faculty ask that the idea of Citizenship be more explicitly explored within the course materials (assignments, readings, etc.). While they can certainly see the implicit link due to the discipline, they were unable to see how the GE ELOs are being explicitly addressed in the course syllabus.
- The reviewing faculty request that a cover letter be provided that details all changes made as a result of the feedback above.

I will return Political Science 2120 to the departmental queue via curriculum.osu.edu in order to address the Panel's feedback.
