On May 9th, the Race, Ethnicity and Gender Diversity Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed the course proposal for AAAS 1101.

The Panel unanimously approved the request with **two contingencies**, one recommendation, and one comment:

- 1. Comment: The Panel recognizes the significant amount of work that went into this revision and commends the department for revising the course so substantially and substantively.
- 2. Contingency: The Panel acknowledges the presence of intersectionality in the course goals (syllabus pg. 1 under "Course Goals and Objectives"), but they would like to see this referenced more clearly at the level of the course readings, lecture topics, and course assignments.
- 3. Contingency: The Panel notes the increased presence of gender diversity and sexuality in the course; however, they would like to see these topics included in the course goals and ELOs (syllabus pg. 1 under "Course Goals and Objectives").
- 4. Recommendation: The Panel recommends removing the reference to the "College of Arts & Humanities" (syllabus pg. 1) and replacing it with "College of Arts and Sciences."

I will return AAAS 1101 to the department queue via curriculum.osu.edu in order to address the Panel's requests.
