On April 25th, the Natural and Mathematical Sciences Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed the course proposals for Math 1125 and 1135.

The Panel voted unanimously to not approve the requests with the following comment, which applies to both courses.:

- a. The Panel feels that these classes do not meet the minimum skill level required for a collegiate mathematics course. While they understand that the pedagogical concepts taught in the course make it appropriate for college credit, the mathematical concepts that are covered do not exceed the level of Math 1075, which is a not-for-credit remedial math course. As such, they feel these courses are not appropriate for inclusion in the GE Foundation: Mathematical and Quantitative Reasoning or Data Analysis category.

I will return Math 1125 and 1135 to the department queue via curriculum.osu.edu in order that the request might be cancelled.
