On Monday, May 2nd, the Arts and Humanities 1 Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a level-change request for Linguistics 3902. Please see below for the Panel's feedback.

Linguistics 3902 was approved with two contingencies and one recommendation. As a reminder, the Panel's contingencies must be satisfied in a contingency submitted to curriculum.osu.edu while the Panel's recommendation may be implemented when the course is next taught.

- **Contingency:** The Panel asks that the Legacy GE Category of Cross-Disciplinary Seminar (GE Goals, ELOs, and a brief rationale explaining how the GE ELOs will be satisfied) be included within the course syllabus. The Legacy GE Goals and ELOs can be found on the ASC Curriculum and Assessment Services website at: https://asccas.osu.edu/curriculum/general-education-goals-and-expected-learning-outcomes.
- **Contingency:** The Panel asks that the language surrounding the GE Theme be removed from the course syllabus until the new Theme is officially approved and the course is approved for that new Theme.
- **Recommendation:** The Panel recommends removing the D- from the course grading scale, as The Ohio State University does not award the letter grade of D-.

I will return Linguistics 3902 to the departmental queue via curriculum.osu.edu in order to address the Panel's feedback.
