OSUCO is open to students, faculty, staff and alumni, and is also open to music majors playing a secondary instrument.

While auditions are not required for entry to the Campus Orchestra, simple auditions for seating purposes are held prior to the start of each semester via video submission of assigned excerpts.

Rehearsals are weekly for 90 minutes, culminating in a public concert towards the end of the semester.
