Good morning,

On Friday, January 27th, the Themes 1 Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a GEN Theme: Citizenship for a Diverse and Just World request for WGSS/AAAS/Comparative Studies 4921. Please see below for their feedback.

I am pleased to report that the Panel unanimously approved the request with one comment they would like for the department to address:

- The WGSS version of the course has the course title of “Intersections: New Approaches to Theorizing Difference” while the AAAS and Comparative Studies versions have the course title of “Intersections: Approaches to Theorizing Difference”. Given that these are cross-listed courses, they are required to have the same title.

Will the departments work together to decide upon a title of the course and reply to this email to let me know your decision? This is an administrative issue that my office can handle directly, so we do not need to send the courses back to your respective departments. Once we have your decision, my office will make that change and advance the courses to OAA.
