The reviewing faculty unanimously approved the request with one recommendation:


i. *Recommendation*: The reviewing faculty recommend that the department include in the syllabus more information about how the course's readings, topics, and assignments will connect explicitly to the goals and ELOs. For example, according to the GEN Submission Form, the idea of anti-colonialism plays a large role in how ELO's 2.1 and 3.2 are met, but this concept is not named on the syllabus or addressed in the course assignments.

As a reminder, *recommendations* (in italics above) should be implemented when the course is next taught.

History 3580 will continue through the approval process.
