On Thursday, February 9<sup>th</sup>, the Arts and Humanities 2 Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a course proposal for Italian 5330.

The Panel unanimously approved the request with two recommendations:

- *The Panel recommends that the syllabus feature the most current mental health statement (found on page 4 of the document), as the name and phone number of the suicide/crisis hotline have changed. As a reminder, *recommendations* (in italics above) should be implemented when the course is next taught. Italian 5330 will continue through the approval process; my office will advance the course to OAA.
