Good afternoon Jen and Birgitte,

On Wednesday, March 1st, the Arts and Humanities 1 Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed new distance learning proposals for History 2550 & 3550.

I am pleased to report that the Panel approved the proposals with one recommendation:

- **Recommendation:** The Panel recommends providing a distinction in the writing assignments between the 2000-level online course and the 3000-level online course that is consistent with the distinction made in their corresponding in-person syllabi. The way the writing assignments in the online syllabi are currently presented, they appear to be the same level of writing, even though the course levels are different.

Both History 2550 and 3550 will continue through the approval process. My office will advance the proposals to OAA.
