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Good afternoon,

On Wednesday, September 20th, the Themes 2 Subcommittee of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a high-impact practice: Research & Creative Inquiry request for Philosophy 2332.

The Subcommittee declined to vote on the proposal, as they'd like the following feedback addressed:

- The reviewing faculty thank the department for their revisions to this proposal. However, at this time, they would like to see additional information surrounding the additional 1 credit hour that accounts for the high-impact practice. Specifically, while they know that the additional hour is coming from a recitation, they would like to see additional information about how students will be spending their time in the Friday workshops and how these workshops contribute to the scaffolding necessary for the applied ethics research paper. They ask that more specificity be provided within the course calendar surrounding the activities of the recitations. Finally, they recommend that the scaffolding that is taking place be broken down within the grade breakdown provided on page 6 under "Research preparation" and, potentially, worth more than 150 points, as it is a significant portion of the coursework and the High-Impact nature of the course.
- The reviewing faculty ask that a cover letter be provided that details any changes made as a result of this feedback.

I will return Philosophy 2332 to the departmental queue via curriculum.osu.edu in order to address the Subcommittee's feedback.
