Proposal: New Area in BFA: Film/Video

The Department of Art BFA program is a 77-credit major and is currently organized around seven emphasis areas of study: Art & Technology, Ceramics, Glass, Painting & Drawing, Photography, Printmaking, and Sculpture. We are proposing to add an eighth focus area to the BFA: Film/Video. BFA majors elect a focus in one of those areas and then take six classes (18 credits) from a menu of Area Requirements. These credits are further supported by 21 credits of Studio Electives, which may include up to 15 credits in the elected emphasis area. The remaining 38 credits come from other required courses: foundation studies, professional practice courses, and electives from a selected menu of studio courses from across the Department of Art. We aim to make the new area available to students in Autumn, 2023.

ART 3009: Film/Video 1 ART 4009: Film/Video 2

ART 5009: Film/Video 3 (repeatable topics course) ART 5019: Film/Video 4 (repeatable topics course)

ART 4101: Moving-Image Art

* ART 4401: 3D Animation with advisor approval, may be counted for area requirement.

Creating this track for our undergraduate majors will serve several purposes. First and foremost, the Department of Art is committed to the creation and study of contemporary and vanguard art practices, and this area will contribute to that on-going mission. Despite a 100year history of art-based film and video making and the fact that film and video has found a place in major museums and galleries around the world, the Department of Art currently does not have a path for students wanting film/video to be the central focus of their artistic practice and studies. We currently have many students who have an interest in this focus but currently have to choose Art & Technology, which is perceived as the closest adjacent field. Since Art and Tech focuses on a range of art technologies (animation, robotics, Internet art, VR), it is often not ideal for the student interested in making Film and Video Art. This new focus area will create a path more aligned with the interests of those students. Second, this new focus area will potentially attract new students who have an interest in filmmaking in the larger context of art and should produce greater demand for our upper-division offerings, allowing us to run these classes more regularly and to increase enrollments for the Department overall. Third, as having a Film/Video Area will take some of the pressure off the faculty in Art & Tech, currently our largest area of the major with only one full-time faculty member.

This Film/Video Area within the Department of Art will not be in competition with other existing majors in film. The Moving-Image Production major is a four-year cohort experience, so any transfer students or students who discover that major later in their academic careers are

not generally in a position to join that major. MIP is also a credit-heavy major—currently 132 credits—so students pursuing double majors often elect not to pursue that major. The Department of Art acknowledges that Film Studies offers a Focus Area in Video Production for their majors, but this amounts to only 3 filmmaking classes with the primary focus still on the required Film Studies classes and electives. A Film/Video Area in Art would place *studio classes* at the center of their major and allow them to go deeper into the production of film and video. With this in mind, Professor Roger Beebe has requested a concurrence from E.J. Westlake, Chair of the Department of Theatre, Film, and Media Arts.

The New Area will work with and support the Department's program goals and the BFA expected learning outcomes, and these will not need to change. We will not need to change our annual assessment plan.

Attached is a BFA plan (GEN) with the Film/Video Area added. The courses already exist within the Department of Art and take into consideration the structure of the BFA. These courses are also already available as electives for students in our BA program, which will not change. This Area will be available to students declaring the major going forward and, except in rare exceptions, we do not anticipate students that are currently in another Area of the BFA and have followed the GEL to transfer into the major.

Embedded Literacies will be fulfilled by the same courses selected by the Department of Art in other Areas (please see BFA plan).

EJ,

ART 3009 actually doesn't count for MIP majors—only 4009, 5009, and 5019 do. I just spoke with Emily Carpenter, and she said MIP students are currently not having any trouble enrolling in 4009. We have also allowed MIP students to jump straight into ART 5009 and 5019, and my hope if we see increased enrollments is that we can begin running one of those each semester rather than just once annually, which is the current pattern. The original MIP proposal actually asked for a section of 5009 or 5019 to run each semester. Emily agreed that any increased demand could be accommodated by ART 5009 and 5019. At present the one section we run annually is generally not even at full enrollment.

I don't expect we'll see 20 Art majors a year choosing the Film/Video track. My guess at first is that a small handful will choose that path. If we see demand ramp up, we can always revisit this conversation.

I was told years ago when starting this program that reserving seats for MIP majors was not an option (for reasons that I never quite understood but that had something to do with the College-level enrollment process), but let me know if you've heard otherwise. I don't think we'd need to reserve seats given what Emily told me about the current level of demand, but I'm absolutely not opposed to doing that.

I'd be happy to schedule a conversation to talk about all this if you still have concerns. Do let me know your thoughts.

Hi, Roger.

My apologies. This was happening right around the time my sister-in-law died, and I forgot to flag it.

I can tell you, this is the concern I've heard from MIP:

We do not have ample seats in 3009 and 4009, but we tend to have adequate seats (when a student is shut out of this course, they are often scheduling late or have lower rank and future opportunities to get into these classes).

With a Film/Video concentration, if 3009 and 4009 suddenly had greater demand from 10-20 more students per year in both of their current offering patterns (1x/semester), we could end up in a challenging situation for our TFMA majors and minors that use these courses... It would perhaps be useful to clarify whether Art intends to increase offerings/seats, or if they would reserve a certain number of seats for MIP majors, the way that ACCAD currently does for us. For example, ACCAD reserves 7 seats per section of the 5001 intro course, 4-5 seats of the 5002 course, for declared MIP majors.

EJ,

I'm writing to request a formal concurrence to the changes we are hoping to make to the film/video curriculum in the Art Department. As I believe I mentioned before, students in Art currently choose a concentration in one of the materials-based "areas"—Art & Technology, Ceramics, Glass, Painting & Drawing, Photography, Printmaking, and Sculpture—each of which consists of 6 courses plus 2 general Art electives. We are planning to add Film/Video as an area, which would simply allow students to focus on the existing film/video curriculum (ART 3009, 4009, 5009, 5019) with two overlapping courses with Art & Tech (ART 4101: Moving-Image Art and ART 4401: Computer Animation). (Note that 5009 and 5019 are repeatable topics classes, so students will likely end up with different combinations of these classes.)

I don't believe this film/video focus area would be in competition with what we're currently offering in MIP/TFMA. My sense is that it simply provides a path for students currently in the Art major who are currently unable to put film/video at the center of their studies (with many likely coming from the pool of Art & Technology students, currently our largest area).

Do let me know if you have questions about this proposed curriculum change. If not and if it has your support, it would be ideal to have your concurrence by the end of next week so that I can move this through our departmental curriculum committee and on to the College committee.
