On Friday, May 12, the Themes 1 Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a new GEN Theme: Citizenship for a Diverse and Just World request for Social Work 3202.

The Panel did not vote on the proposal as they would like the following feedback items addressed:

- The reviewing faculty ask that the course more thoroughly explain how it will engage with the GEN Theme of Citizenship for a Diverse and Just World. In its current form, they are unsure how students will be engaging with the GEN Theme Goals and ELOs and ask that this be made more explicit on the course syllabus.
- The reviewing faculty concur with their colleagues on the Theme Advisory Group and would like to see more information on how this course will engage with the GEN Theme. Specifically, they would like to see more information on how citizenship will be engaged with in the course assignments, course description, course readings, and the daily schedule.
- The reviewing faculty ask that the universal Themes Goals and ELOs (Goals 1 and 2 and their corresponding ELOs) be added to the course syllabus, as they are currently missing on page 2 of the syllabus. They also ask that a brief explanatory rationale be provided for these GEN Goals and ELOs. - The reviewing faculty ask that a cover letter be submitted that details all changes made as a result of this feedback.

I will return Social Work 3202 to the departmental queue via curriculum.osu.edu in order to address the Panel's above feedback.
