On Wednesday September 6th, the Themes 2 Subcommittee of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a GEN Theme: Citizenship for a Diverse and Just World proposal for AAAS 3110.

I am pleased to report that the Subcommittee unanimously approved the request with three recommendations:

- **Recommendation:** The reviewing faculty offer the friendly recommendation that the instructor engage with different concepts of citizenship in different social, historical, and cultural contexts, either at the beginning of the course or at various points throughout the course.
- **Recommendation:** The reviewing faculty recommend removing the reference to the “OSU Grade Scheme” on page 6 of syllabus, as Ohio State does not have a standardized or required grading scheme. Course instructors are free to utilize a grading scheme that best suits the needs of their classroom and course.
- **Recommendation:** The reviewing faculty recommend updating the Title IX statement as found on page 8 of the syllabus. Molly Peirano is no longer the Title IX coordinator. AAAS 3110 will continue through the approval process. My office will advance the course to OAA.
