On Friday, January 17th, the Themes II Subcommittee of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a new GEN Theme: Citizenship for a Diverse and Just World request for SASIA 3635.

I am pleased to report that the Subcommittee unanimously approved the request with two recommendations:

- **Recommendation:** The reviewing faculty recommend providing more detail on how the final project (as found on pages 7-8 of the course syllabus) connects to the GEN Theme category. They believe that this will be beneficial to students and allow them to make better connections to the GEN Theme category.
- **Recommendation:** The reviewing faculty recommend updating the Diversity statement (as found on page 9 of the course syllabus), as it was updated for the 2024-25 academic year. The most up-to-date statement can be found on the ASC Curriculum and Assessment Services website.
