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Good morning Alisa,

On Monday, August 19th, the Themes I Subcommittee of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a GEN Theme: Health and Wellbeing request for Psychology 2311.

I am pleased to report that the Subcommittee unanimously approved the request with two contingencies and one recommendation:

- Contingency: The reviewing faculty ask that the Religious Accommodation statement be updated within the course syllabus (as found on page 8). On March 1st, 2024, the Arts and Sciences Curriculum Committee updated the required statement to be in compliance with the new statement provided by the Office of Undergraduate Education and vetted by the Office of Legal Affairs. The newly updated statement has been updated on the [syllabus elements page of the ASC Curriculum and Assessment Services website](#).
- Contingency: The reviewing faculty note that the prerequisite for this course has been removed within the curriculum.osu.edu form. However, on page 2 of the syllabus, under Course Information, the syllabus still mentions the prerequisite of Psych 1100 or 1100H. They ask that this reference be removed from the course syllabus.
- Recommendation: The reviewing faculty recommend updating the Student Life – Disability Services statement, as it was recently updated for the 2024-2025 academic year. The new statement can be found on the [ASC Curriculum and Assessment Services website](#). Additionally, they recommend that the Lima campus statement be updated, as the contact person for Disability Services on the Lima campus has changed. This updated Lima statement can be found on the [Office of Undergraduate Education website](#).

I will return Psychology 2311 to the departmental queue via curriculum.osu.edu in order to address the Subcommittee's above contingencies.
