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Good afternoon Jenifer and Gina,

On Wednesday, October 18th, the Themes 2 Subcommittee of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a new GEN Theme: Citizenship for a Diverse and Just World proposal for Art 3008.

The Subcommittee declined to vote on the proposal at this time, as they would like the following feedback incorporated into a revision submitted via curriculum.osu.edu:

- The reviewing faculty ask that the course syllabus more clearly define the assignment descriptions and how the assignments will engage with the GEN Theme Citizenship-specific ELOs of 3.1, 3.2, 4.1, and 4.2. They were unclear on the course assignments and how they will connect students to the Theme and believe stronger assignment descriptions will assist students in making these connections.
- The reviewing faculty of the Themes Subcommittee concur with their colleagues on the Theme Advisory Group and would like to see additional information surrounding the course assignments and how these link to the ELOs common to all Themes. Specifically, the reviewing faculty are unable to determine if this proposal will be an advanced study (ELO 1.2) or provide opportunities for reflection (ELO 2.2).
- The reviewing faculty ask that a cover letter be submitted that details all changes made as a result of this feedback.

I will return Art 3008 to the departmental queue via curriculum.osu.edu in order to address the Subcommittee's feedback.
