On Monday, November 6th, the Arts and Humanities 1 Subcommittee of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a new course request for Art Education 7712.

I am pleased to report that the Subcommittee unanimously approved the request with one contingency and three recommendations:

- **Contingency:** The Arts and Sciences Curriculum Committee recently updated the list of required syllabus statements for all syllabi within the College to include a statement on religious accommodations. This new, required statement is a result of a directive by the Executive Vice President and Provost and [can be found here on the ASC Curriculum and Assessment Services website](#). The Subcommittee thanks you for adding this statement to your course syllabus.
- **Recommendation:** The reviewing faculty offer the friendly recommendation to update the Student Life – Disability Services statement in the course syllabus, as it was recently updated for the 2023-24 academic year. The most up-to-date [statements can be found here](#) on the ASC Curriculum and Assessment website.
- **Recommendation:** The Subcommittee recommend that the final paper requirements be clarified within the course syllabus, as a 6,000 to 10,000-word journal style paper is a significant course requirement.
- **Recommendation:** The Subcommittee recommends reviewing the syllabus and updating the COVID-19 language to be in line with current policy and procedures.

I will return Art Education 7712 to the departmental queue via curriculum.osu.edu in order to address the Subcommittee's feedback.
