On Wednesday, November 15th, the Themes 2 Subcommittee of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a new GEN Theme: Migration, Mobility, and Immobility request for Classics 3203.

I am pleased to report that the Subcommittee unanimously approved the request with one contingency and two recommendations:

- **Contingency:** The Arts and Sciences Curriculum Committee recently updated their list of required syllabus statements to include a statement on religious accommodations. This new, required statement is a result of a directive by the Executive Vice President and Provost and [can be found here on the ASC Curriculum and Assessment Services website](#). The Subcommittee thanks you for adding this statement to your course syllabus.
- **Recommendation:** The reviewing faculty recommend providing additional clarity and connection to the Theme by further linking the course assignments/assessments to the GEN Theme category of Migration, Mobility, and Immobility.
- **Recommendation:** The reviewing faculty offer the friendly recommendation to update the Student Life – Disability Services statement in the course syllabus, as it has been recently updated for the 2023-24 academic year.
