On Tuesday, January 16th, the Arts and Humanities 1 Subcommittee of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a new distance learning request for English 2276.

I am pleased to report that the proposal was unanimously approved with two contingencies:

- **Contingency:** The Subcommittee asks that the course syllabus include the legacy General Education Goals, ELOs, and explanatory paragraph for the category which the course is approved within. As a reminder, English 2276 is approved for GEL category Cultures and Ideas and the Goals and ELOs can be found on the <u>ASC Curriculum and Assessment Services website</u> here
- **Contingency:** The Subcommittee asks that the course syllabus include the full Goals and ELOs for the new General Education Theme: Citizenship for a Diverse and Just World. Currently, on pages 3-5 of the course syllabus, the information regarding the Citizenship category has been customized for the course content. It is a requirement of all General Education syllabi to have the Goals and ELOs for the GE categories they are approved within exactly as they were approved by the Office of Academic Affairs. I will return English 2276 to the departmental queue via curriculum.osu.edu in order to allow the department to address the Subcommittee's feedback.
