Good morning,

On Friday, February 9th, the Social and Behavioral Sciences Subcommittee of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a new course proposal for Economics 8877.

The Subcommittee unanimously approved the proposal with **three contingencies** and *two recommendations*:

- **Contingency**: The Subcommittee requests that the department clarify how students will lead discussion if there is no required outside reading. Will the discussion revolve around lecture topics? If so, what is the role of the recommended readings? [Syllabus p. 2]
- **Contingency**: The Subcommittee requests that the department use the most recent version of the Student Life Disability Services Statement, which was updated to reflect the university's new COVID-19 policies in August 2023. The updated statement can be found in an easy to copy/paste format on the <u>Arts and Sciences Curriculum and Assessment Services website</u>. [Syllabus p. 7]
- **Contingency**: The Subcommittee requests that the department add the required religious accommodations statement into the syllabus. The Arts and Sciences Curriculum Committee recently updated the list of required syllabus statements for all syllabi to include a statement on religious accommodations. This new, required statement is a result of a directive by the Executive Vice President and Provost and can be found in an easy to copy/paste format on the Arts and Sciences Curriculum and Assessment Services website.
- Recommendation: The Subcommittee recommends that the department use the most recent version of the diversity statement if it wishes to keep the statement in the syllabus. The updated statement can be found in an easy to copy/paste format on the Arts and Sciences
 Curriculum and Assessment Services website. [Syllabus p. 5]
- Recommendation: The Subcommittee recommends that the department use the most recent version of the mental health statement if it wishes to keep the statement in the syllabus. The statement was updated to include the new Suicide and Crisis Lifeline number. The updated statement can be found in an easy to copy/paste format on the Arts and Sciences Curriculum and Assessment Services website. [Syllabus p. 6]

As a reminder, **contingencies** (in bold above) must be addressed and resubmitted via curriculum.osu.edu before a course can move forward in the approval process. *Recommendations* (in italics above) should be implemented when the course is next taught.

I will return Economics 8877 to the department queue via curriculum.osu.edu in order to address the Subcommittee's requests.
