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Good afternoon Dave and Eva,

On Tuesday, March 19th, the Arts and Humanities 1 Subcommittee of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a new course proposal for Music 3354.

I am pleased to report that the Subcommittee unanimously approved the request with one comment, one contingency, and one recommendation:

- **Comment:** The Subcommittee would like to communicate that the School of Music should inform the College of Education and Human Ecology's Department of Teaching & Learning about this course, as one of their faculty members teaches coursework in an adjacent field and there may be opportunities for collaboration, as well as potentially garnering interest from students in the College of Education and Human Ecology.
- **Contingency:** The Subcommittee asks that the Religious Accommodation statement be updated within the course syllabus. On March 1st, 2024, the Arts and Sciences Curriculum Committee updated the required statement to be in compliance with the new statement, which was provided by the Office of Undergraduate Education and vetted by the Office of Legal Affairs. The newly updated statement has been updated on the [syllabus elements page of the ASC Curriculum and Assessment Services website](#).
- **Recommendation:** The Subcommittee recommends updating the Mental Health statement to the most up-to-date statement, as the National Suicide Hotline phone number has recently changed. The most up-to-date statement can be found on the [ASC Curriculum and Assessment Services website](#).

I will return Music 3354 to the School's queue in order to address the Subcommittee's feedback.
