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Good afternoon,

On Tuesday, March 19th, the Arts and Humanities 1 Subcommittee of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a new first-year seminar request for a seminar titled "Hi, Who Are You? An Exploration in Autoethnography".

I am pleased to report that the Subcommittee unanimously approved the proposal with one contingency and two recommendations:

- **Contingency:** The Subcommittee asks that the Religious Accommodation statement be updated within the course syllabus. On March 1st, 2024, the Arts and Sciences Curriculum Committee updated the required statement to be in compliance with the new statement, which was provided by the Office of Undergraduate Education and vetted by the Office of Legal Affairs. The newly updated statement has been updated on the <u>syllabus elements page</u> of the ASC Curriculum and Assessment Services website.
- **Recommendation:** The Subcommittee recommends providing a breakdown of what percentage of total class points students should earn to receive individual letter grades. Currently, on page 2 of the syllabus, it simply says that the course will be assessed utilizing A-E letter grades.
- **Recommendation:** The Subcommittee recommends providing the weekly topics and readings by week, rather than simply numbering them 1-15. While they recognize and acknowledge these correspond to the seminar weeks, new first-year students may not understand this format.

As a reminder, the Subcommittee's contingency must be satisfied in a revision while their recommendations may be implemented when the course is first taught.

When revisions are completed, please email a copy to me and Bernadette Vankeerbergen, Assistant Dean for Curriculum, and we will ensure the proposal receives the appropriate review.
