On Thursday, April 25th, the Themes II Subcommittee of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a new GEN Theme: Citizenship for a Diverse and Just World and High-Impact Practice: Research & Creative Inquiry request for Slavic/Theatre 3711. Please see below for the Subcommittee's feedback:

GEN Theme: Citizenship for a Diverse and Just World

I am pleased to report that the Subcommittee has unanimously approved the request.

High-Impact Practice: Research & Creative Inquiry

I am pleased to report that the Subcommittee has unanimously approved the request with two contingencies:

- **Contingency:** The reviewing faculty would like to see additional explanation for students, in the course syllabus, about what makes this experience a four-credit hour, high-impact experience. While they understand (from page 4 of the syllabus) that the course will meet for the appropriate amount of contact hours, they ask that additional information be provided that clearly explains to students how they will have a high-impact experience. They ask that some of the very descriptive information from the High-Impact Practice: Research & Creative Inquiry form be added into the syllabus.
- **Contingency:** The reviewing faculty ask that a cover letter be submitted that addresses all changes made as a result of their feedback.

I will return both Slavic and Theatre 3711 to the departmental queues via curriculum.osu.edu in order to address the Subcommittee's feedback.
