On Tuesday, September 17<sup>th</sup>, the Arts and Humanities 1 Subcommittee of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a DL request for Classics 2206 (<https://ascnet.osu.edu/request/6057>). I am pleased to report that the Subcommittee approved the request with the following feedback:

- **Comment:** The Subcommittee appreciates the relationship between the asynchronous components and the optional live sessions mentioned in the syllabus.
- **Recommendation:** The Subcommittee recommends that it be specified in the mode of delivery section of the syllabus that the course is asynchronous. [Syllabus p. 6]
- **Recommendation:** The Subcommittee recommends that the department use the most recent version of the Student Life Disability Services Statement, which was updated in summer of 2024. The updated statement can be found in an easy to copy/paste format on the [Arts and Sciences Curriculum and Assessment Services website](#). [Syllabus pp. 24-25]

As a reminder, *recommendations* (in italics above) should be implemented when the course is next taught.

Classics 2206 will continue through the approval process to OAA.
